MOTOR GRADER SAFETY

ON THE WORKSITE

Know and avoid the machine's pinch points such as the articulation area.

Learn the machine width in order to maintain proper clearances from nearby objects. Motor Graders are a part of many construction and mining sites. Operators should read and learn from the Operation & Maintenance Manual and keep in mind some key safety points.

Machine safety begins with conducting a pre-operation walkaround before every shift. Report any broken or non-working parts to the maintenance manager or the proper person on the worksite.

Reduce speed and keep the Motor Grader in gear when traveling over rough, uneven terrain or hills. Avoid turning on a slope.

Buckle the seat belt; stay seated while operating the controls.

Use three-points of contact when mounting or dismounting.

Never drive along a ditch or excavation too closely, due to potential collapse.

Ground the blade and any work tools whenever the grader is left unattended.

Never allow anyone to work beneath a raised blade.

Keep windows clean and clear of dust, dirt

and other debris that

limits visibility.

Watch for overhead wires and other overhead hazards when the blade (moldboard) is turned up at a sharp angle.
