Working near roadways is hazardous. Training employees on safety protocols helps them identify risks, use protective gear, and respond to emergencies, which can help reduce accidents and fatalities.

Maintain Equipment

- Downed equipment causes traffic hazards; implement a maintenance plan to prevent this.
- Maintain detailed lubrication and repair records and use oil analysis to predict failures.

Traffic & Regulatory Compliance

- Follow each state's rules for signage, speed limits, flagging, and night operations.
- Train flaggers and safety staff for night work; maintain lighting systems as per specs.

Equipment Housekeeping

- Clean operator decks, handrails, and walking surfaces every day to prevent slips and falls.
- Steam clean areas with hydraulic leaks to reduce fire hazards.

Fire Prevention

- Install and maintain fire suppression systems, keeping extinguishers nearby.
- Train crews in emergency fire response procedures.

Communication Protocols

- Equip all workers and vehicles with industrial-grade radios.
- Train crews on radio use and maintain assignment logs for each unit.

PPE & Crew Gear

- Require personnel wear long sleeves, full-length pants, safety vests and hard hats.
- Provide color-coded hard hats for new crew members.
